

s you may have heard, the Grand Priory of Canada Council resolved to discontinue funding the printing of the annual North American directory. The cost for this year's edition was estimated at between \$15,000 and \$20,000 (which would be shared with the Grand Priory of USA). This expense did not include the cost of distributing the directories, many of which were reported to have gone to waste each year as SOSJ members relied upon other directory sources. As such, we believe the money can be put to better use in assisting in growth of membership in our grand priory.

Commensurate with this decision we have taken steps to ensure that a full international directory is available online at the SOSJ International Website. This includes the European members and is to be updated monthly. Webmaster, H E Conventual Bailiff Grand Marshal Richard D. Earthy, GCSJ, MMSJ advises that member photos will soon be included in the online directory.

I know that some members will be disappointed. If you have not already done so, members are urged to go to the SOSJ International website at www.sosjinternational.org, click on Member Registration and fill in the simple form to request access to the website. You will then be granted access to the entire online worldwide membership directory as well as a wealth of additional SOSJ information. Also, we are working on making available a downloadable PDF (and printable) version of the directory should you wish to have a digital or printed version at your disposal.

Tour Options During SCM 2020




What a program your SCM 2020 Committee has put together. In addition to a packed week of meeting activities and presentations, a series of optional tours have been arranged.

Have you registered for SCM 2020? It's time to spread the word.

n slightly less than nine months the world of SOSJ will be coming to Vancouver for the 2020 Sovereign Council Meeting. Please make sure you have registered and, while we are at it, we need your help to raise the profile of the event with other members you may know to encourage them to participate.

Sovereign Council Meetings are held at a different city every two years. The last time Vancouver hosted was in the year 2000. Over the years our members have travelled to British, European (Mediterranean) and other North American destinations. Ask our fellow members how they have developed friendships with both local and visiting members, and learned more about their cultures and beautiful homelands and the vital work of the Sovereign Order being done around the globe for the Lord's sick and the poor.

And what a program the Vancouver 2020 SCM will be. Registered members and guests are invited to observe the Sovereign Council Meetings on Thursday and Friday, a presentation Wednesday on the history and future of the Sovereign Order by a former Grand Master, and get to meet like-minded members and their guests who have already registered from Denmark, England, Finland, France, Hungary, Scotland, the United States, across Canada and Australia. And, talk about value for money! We have managed to reduce the usual SCM cost by 25%, a substantial reduction from recent Sovereign Council Meetings.

The week starts with a welcome reception hosted by the Grand Priory of Canada, includes a Vancouver Harbour Tour with lunch on Wednesday, a dinner at the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club on Thursday and a reception on Friday hosted by the Vancouver Commandery. Saturday, September 19, will be Vancouver's Investiture Service at Christ Church Cathedral followed by the Gala Dinner in the Pan Pacific Hotel Crystal Ballroom.

For those staying at the Pan Pacific, the room rates negotiated over two years ago are stunningly less than the current rack rate and even a better bargain when considering the declining number of hotel rooms and the number of events being held in Vancouver this coming September.

Optional tours following the Sovereign Council Meeting include an Alaskan Cruise and a special Rocky Mountaineer Rail Tour. On Tuesday, September 15 there is an optional tour to Victoria and its world-famous Butchart Gardens. (The tour is being updated following the business closure of one of the vendors. It is hoped to be able to post the new details on the International website in the near future.)



Attributes and Approval of a Member

Becoming a Member of the Sovereign Order's Vancouver Commandery

The Membership Committee is always seeking nominations of potential members of the Vancouver Commandery of the Sovereign Order of St. John, Knights Hospitaller (the "Order"). What attributes in a proposed member are sought? What is the process for one's becoming invested as a member?

Attributes Sought

The Membership Committee ("MC") and Commandery Council ("CC") have recently approved "Policy and Procedures" guidelines for the conduct of the MC. The guidelines set out the following attributes to be possessed by a male or female person who is nominated to become a member of the Order (a "Nominee"):

- Is a person of integrity
- Believes in charity and the traditions of chivalry
- Wishes to serve in a group of like-minded individuals
- Is Christian and believes in an ecumenical focus
- Supports charity based on need and not religion
- Has a significant record of philanthropy through a commitment of time, talent or treasure
- Is 23 years of age or older
- Considers membership to be an honour and recognition of their community involvement, personal reputation and integrity

Steps in Approval Process

The first step in the approval process is for two members of the Order who are in good standing to complete and sign a Nomination form as "Proposers" and deliver the completed nomination along with a curriculum vitae or biography for the Nominee (often available by Google or LinkedIn), to the MC for vetting, which is the second step.

Following vetting approval by MC, the third step is for the Nomination material to be delivered by the MC to the CC, for a second vetting.

Once the Nominee has passed vetting by both MC and CC, the fourth step is for the Proposers to meet with the Nominee to review a MC membership brochure containing a Petition for Admission and informational material. Only then may the Proposers inform the Nominee that a vetting process for him or her has been completed successfully.

The fifth step is for the Petition for Admission to be completed by the Nominee, as "Petitioner", and the two Proposers, as "Guarantors".

The sixth and final step is for the completed Petition, along with two passport type photos of the Petitioner and his/her cheque for the required fees, to be delivered to the Chair of the MC who will sign the Petition and send it

to the Administrator of the Commandery for signature approval by the Commander, the Prior of the Lower Mainland BC and the Grand Prior for Canada. Once those signatures have been obtained, the Petitioner will become an "Aspirant" who, with other aspirants, will receive orientation by the Marshal and eventual Investiture in Christ Church Cathedral by the Grand Master, who will dub the Aspirant as a Knight or Dame, then receiving a red cape bearing the white cross of Malta and various regalia of the Order.

Final Comment

Nominees who have the above attributes and pass vetting by MC and CC can then Petition to become admitted to the Order and be invested as Knights and Dames. They become the lifeblood of our Sovereign Order.

Almoner Committee Update

2019 was a Year of Building Partnerships and Showing Leadership in Hospice Palliative Care



Since December 2018, the Sovereign Order of St. John has been a driving force in the formation of the Provincial Hospice Working Group (PHWG) alongside representatives from BC Centre for Palliative Care, BC Hospice Palliative

Care Association, and Vancouver Island Federation of Hospices. This group of dedicated professionals stands to sit at the provincial table to improve the quality of hospice palliative care. In 2019 the PHWG membership finalized its terms of reference and has gathered inputs from hospices and related organizations throughout British Columbia.

With the information garnered from our information gathering in 2019 a review of the current provincial environment was conducted, resulting in proposed solutions to set the foundations and shape the future improvements of hospice palliative care in BC.

It was learned, with the rapid increase in the number of seniors in Canada who are living with chronic conditions and have complex needs, the demand for community-based integrated care to support Canadians to age and die well in their residence is growing exponentially.

A recent study showed that Canadians who received hospice palliative care are 2.5 times more likely to die with dignity at home or home-like settings. The overall goal of hospice palliative care is to improve the quality of life for patients and their families facing serious illness. Palliative care is especially effective in improving outcomes of older adults with serious illnesses, including their families, when started as early as possible, independent of their place of residence.

In BC, there are more than 70 hospice societies located across the province in remote, rural, suburban and urban communities. Hospice societies provide integrated, person and family-centred care and support in hospices, long-term care facilities, hospitals

and the community. Well-trained hospice volunteers and clinical staff provide a number of services to the community such as psychosocial programs, bereavement counselling, service navigation, caregiver support and advance care planning, all part of hospices' model of integrative care.

The Provincial Hospice Working Group (PHWG), represented by the BC Centre for Palliative Care, Victoria Hospice, Vancouver Island Federation of Hospices, Sovereign Order of St. John, and BC Hospice Palliative Care Association, envisions a collaborative network of organizations that will be instrumental in improving access to community-based whole person care to patients and their families in BC.

The PHWG and your Sovereign Order Almoner Committee participants will be presenting its findings and views at the BC Care Providers Association Conference this May in Whistler. The conference theme, entitled 20/20: A Vision for Seniors will take a retrospective view of the past 20 years, and focus on what seniors' care and living should look like 20 years from now. The presentations will be followed by an engaging group discussion to identify the needs of participants' communities and ways to collaborate to meet those needs.

The Dugout has been providing food, comfort and a warm place for over half a century.

The Dugout, as it is known on Vancouver's Downtown Eastside, is a safe place where people in need can come for hot food and beverages, good company, and a safe place to rest their street-weary bones. Sort of a cross between a coffee shop and a soup kitchen, the Dugout, the creation of Reverend Bob Burrows, opened its doors to those who are in need in December 1967.

A Vancouver Sun article summed up Rev. Burrows as follows... "Bob Burrows, the Dugout's founder and 52 years later still its treasurer, is a fascinating study in altruism, public service, Welsh-choir singing and, in his early days, as a bush pilot who took his United Church ministry to remote lighthouses, logging camps and dozens of other remote ports of call from his base in Alert Bay."

Volunteer, and one-time client of The Dugout, David Williams says, "There is no judgment at the Dugout, there's no attitude, and it's all because of Mr. Burrows. He's the architect of the Dugout."

"We wanted to provide a beer-parlour atmosphere, but have coffee instead of beer," said Burrows. "A group of (church) volunteers scraped and painted the place to get it ready." In December 1967, just months after 'the

plunge, the Dugout opened its door. It has been serving soup and offering a haven every single day since — 600 people a day enjoy its hot meals and comfort. The Out-To-Lunch Bunch, legends in Alcoholics Anonymous circles, have been meeting every single day as well, for almost as long as the Dugout has been in existence.

In 2019 the Dugout made an application to the SOSJ Almoner Committee. In January of this year the Almoner Committee visited The Dugout and presented Rev. Burrows with a cheque for \$11,500 to support his work on behalf of the Downtown Eastside's needy.

New Grant Application Process Now Online

We are excited to announce the launch of our new online grant application format, effective for our first-quarter deadline of March 1, 2020. In response to the feedback we have received from our former grant recipients, we have incorporated their input into the new format.

The goal of the new format is, above all, to better enable applicants to successfully complete the required information.

Under the Grants section of the Vancouver Commandery website, applicants will find a web-based Application Form, along with an informative Application Guide, and a Grant Evaluation Guide.

So whether someone is applying for a grant for the first time or has applied before, the information in this improved form and guide will help applicants complete the Sovereign Order of St. John (SOSJ) grant application as easily as possible.

Take the time to visit our website and familiarise yourself with our Grant process and criteria. We welcome feedback from SOSJ members.

2010 - A Look Back To Year Of The Olympics

And a look back into our Vancouver Commandery that year.

ith the Sovereign Council Meeting due to arrive in September 2020, I was immediately brought back to another significant event to visit Vancouver a decade earlier-The 2010 Winter Olympics, officially known as the XXI Olympic Winter Games.

Approximately 2,600 athletes from 82 nations participated in 86 events in fifteen disciplines. Both the Olympic and Paralympic Games were organized by the Vancouver Organizing Committee (VANOC), headed by John Furlong.

For the first time, Canada won gold in an official sport at an Olympic Games hosted at home, clinching our first gold medal on the second day of the competition. Canada went on to become the first host nation since Norway in 1952 to lead the gold medal count. With 14, Canada broke the record for the most gold medals won at a single Winter Olympics.

So how could I not resist going into the "Way Back" machine (thanks to our website) and have a look at what we were up to in 2010? Our Commander was Robert Trowbridge (then KJSJ) now KCJSJ, who, with the various Committees were busy in preparations for the 2010 Investiture.

2010 was also the year for our SCM to be held in Budapest, Hungary which was significant in our Reunification into one 'Order of the Orders', a process of Alliance that had begun in the year 2000. Locally we were hard at work raising funds for the St. John Hospice project at UBC. How much has been done in a decade! Then, as now, we were blessed with a first-class field of Aspirants who have gone on to do much good work for our Commandery today. Here are a few photos from 2010. The year that was!






















On The Social Scene


