

MEET OUR VICE-COMMANDER

Vice-Commander Dr. Richard Crow is a distinguished physician, health care leader, and devoted member of the Sovereign Order, whose career has been marked by unwavering dedication to healing, advocacy, and service to others.

Richard earned his Doctor of Medicine from the University of British Columbia in 1983 and completed his Family Practice Residency at the University of Western Ontario in 1985. His early career saw him practicing medicine in both

rural and urban Ontario before relocating back to Victoria in 1990, where he co-owned and practiced in a thriving family practice and Treatment Centre. Over the course of three decades, Richard held progressively senior leadership roles within Island Health and its predecessor organizations, serving as Executive Medical Director across several portfolios and twice as Acting Vice President of Medicine. From 2010 to 2012, he was Executive Vice President and Chief Medical Officer, and was Island Health's longest-serving Executive Medical Director.

An educator as well as a clinician, Richard long championed the next generation of physicians. He has served as Clinical Assistant Professor at UBC's Faculty of Medicine, Family Medicine Residency Lead Faculty for Curriculum across six sites, and was recognized in 2000 as a Fellow of the College of Family Physicians of Canada. His contributions extended provincially through his involvement in all three key Joint Committees: Specialist Services, Shared Care, and General Practice Services.

Throughout his career, Richard has been a staunch advocate for comprehensive primary care and equitable access to mental health and substance use services. He was instrumental in shaping addiction medicine as a program and expanding services to address the toxic drug supply crisis. His leadership was defined by compassion, courage, and an unwavering stand against stigma.

Since joining the Sovereign Order in 2016, Chevalier Crow has contributed extensively to the Victoria Commandery. He has served on the Fundraising, Hospitaller, Membership, and Almoner Committees, organized successful Investiture Auctions, hosted numerous committee meetings, and lent his voice and expertise to initiatives supporting marginalized populations. Recently re-elected to Council, he continues to contribute as our Vice Commander.

OUR MISSION IN ACTION

COMMUNITY GRANTS

Grants Committee members are busy receiving and reviewing final reports for 2024 grants and the 2025 Community Grants applications received on the online portal, which closed Sept 12th.

Final Reports contain a wealth of information, including the number and demographics of those served and how successful the grant was improving the lives of those underserved. They also contain testimonials and photos of the good work being done. We will work to collate this information and share it with you over the next few weeks.

We have 91 applications and 84 qualifying for Assessment. Requests are reflective of what our environmental scan reveals: help with food insecurity takes the lion's share of the requests, followed by assistance for youth & seniors in crisis, mental health supports, programs for underhoused populations, support for those with brain injuries, and women with children fleeing violence.

Thanks to our partnership with the Times Colonist Christmas Fund, we are pleased to be helping those charities serving vulnerable populations as far north as Campbell River on Vancouver Island for the first time this year.

Our timeline is to complete the application reviews before October 21st with a final approval by the Times Colonist and our Council/Board by October 27th.

We expect to deliver cheques starting the second week of November so that charities can be well prepared for Christmas needs and in time for the Times Colonist Christmas Fund kick off.

SENIORS CHRISTMAS SUPPORT PROGRAM

(A PARTNERSHIP WITH SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL)

Our team of Bernie Beck, Marty Schubert, and Donna Davidson is gearing up to launch this year's Christmas Senior's Support Program (thank you!). For the 6th year, we aim to serve over 400 seniors relying on food banks year-round, with a grocery gift card to enrich their food intake at this special time of year. This popular initiative draws



over 20 Sovereign Order members to deliver to those seniors who have difficulty accessing the pickup location. A recent meeting of senior leadership with Sovereign Order and SVdP, was very successful, resulting in further strengthening our relationship with additional recognition and support committed from SVdP. This is viewed by SVdP as a critical program to support seniors going forward.

Every Friday, Backpack Buddies delivers bags of food to hundreds of the island's most vulnerable children. They ensure the children have the meals and snacks they need to last the weekend.

Pleased to announce, similar to last year, members of the SOSJ Victoria Commandery will have the opportunity to volunteer with Backpack Buddies for the 2025/26 School Year. Last year our volunteer packing teams set a record number of bags we packed - 1048 bags total, to be surpassed this coming year.

First, in recognition of her exceptional leadership, remarkable contributions, and unwavering commitment, the Victoria Commandery is awarding Maria the Medal of Merit.

Second, in recognition of her leadership, and particularly her exceptional service as the Prior of Cascadia, it has just been announced that she is elevated to the high rank and prestigious position of a Bailiff of our Sovereign Order.

Maria Dominelli is a highly esteemed and dedicated leader of the Victoria Commandery. She is known and recognized for her outstanding service, leadership, and community outreach over the past six years. Her contributions include serving Victoria as Commander, Prior, and Chair of the Strategic Planning Committee, mentoring successors, and actively participating in numerous community initiatives.

In her present role as our Commandery's Almoner, she has been the driving force and led the transformation of the Commandery's charitable efforts over the past four years. Under her guidance, our Commandery has expanded its community charitable grants from a small number, in a relatively modest amount of \$80,000, to an impressive 69 grants amounting to \$847,860 in 2024.

She and her Committee have achieved this by establishing the means to identify community needs, establishing partnerships—including one with the Times Colonist Christmas Fund —and developing rigorous analytical processes to identify and support a large number of community organizations that are providing programs that address food insecurity and other important social needs.

As a Commandery, we are so fortunate to have been one of the prime beneficiaries of Maria's exceptional service and commitment to the values and mission of the Sovereign Order.
